The IERL major with a concentration in Spanish requires a minimum of 8 courses in Economics and 6 in Spanish beginning at 20202 or above. Students are also required to take a one-credit course, "Exploring International Economics," and must complete a senior research project or equivalent designed to integrate their studies of economics and language and culture.

Literature and culture classes at the 40000 level may count toward the 2 core courses in advanced literature and culture or as electives but may not double count. Courses at the 30000 level but below 30710 or courses at the 30000 level whose focus is not literature and culture may not count toward the core courses in advanced literature and culture.

Equivalent literature and culture courses from international study programs or other universities may be substituted with departmental approval. A minimum of fifty percent of the credits toward the major must be taken in residence at Notre Dame. AP or SAT credit may not be applied toward the major.

Students are allowed to take one related course in English outside of the department of Romance Languages and Literatures or one course in Spanish outside of the department with the approval of the Director of Undergraduate Studies (DUS), that can count as an advanced elective toward the major.
