

## Overview of Undergraduate Majors in Italian

Eight options! a **Major**, **Supplementary Major**, and **Honors Major** in each of two concentrations, plus a **Minor** and a combined five-year **BA/MA**.

The **Literature and Culture Concentration** is for students who want the deepest immersion in the language, and who wish to study great literature, cinema, and general Italian culture. This concentration corresponds to the original majors in Italian, and is recommended also for anyone contemplating graduate work in Italian.

The **Italian Studies Concentration** is for students who wish to craft their own broader interdisciplinary program centered on Italy, based on proficiency in the language and a grounding in the culture.

Courses **20000 level and above count**; no more than two 20000 courses count (ROIT 20215 counts as two).

Lang/lit/culture courses originate in the Italian program (ROIT) and generally focus on language, literary texts, cinema, and general Italian culture.

Italian studies courses have listings in other programs, such as LLRO, Art History, History, Classics, Music, FTT, Architecture, Political Science, etc.... (relevant courses may or may not be crosslisted ROIT).
