While the literary critiques have focused on her linguistic production (verse/prose poetry, letters, diaries, literary analyses, and posthumous texts), my work brings to light the pictorial, graphical aspects of her production. I present a first reading of Pizarnik's drawings, arguing that it is necessary to understand them within the continuum of Pizarnik's poetic work, given that the drawings open and expand the fixed image held of Pizarnik as a dark poet.
